

REVIVAL MEETINGS HELD IN NORTH LAS VEGAS

Dr. William Thomas, Director of Overseas Crusades Ministries in France, will hold a series of revival meetings in local churches throughout Las Vegas Valley during the week of Sept. 7-12 (Tuesday-Sunday).

Dr. Thomas has held successful evangelistic campaigns on five continents and also served five years as a Baptist missionary in Zaire from 1967-71. His most recent meetings have been in Norway, Sweden, Rumania, Poland, East and West Germany, Scotland, Czechoslovakia, England, France, Spain, Sierra Leone, Martinique, Greece, Belgium, Guadeloupe, and the United States. He served as an interpreter at the Billy Graham Crusade in Brussels and Eurofest '75, for Baptist World Alliance Congress in Stockholm, and the World Conference on Evangelization at Lausanne. He is also a member of the Press Corps in Europe for Christianity Today Magazine.

Bill Thomas preaches in English, French, Spanish, German and Lingala (Zaire dialect). He earned his doctorate in Missions and Evangelism at Free University of Amsterdam, Holland. Despite his international ministry over the past several years, he was born in South Carolina and grew up as a teenager in Harlem, New York City.

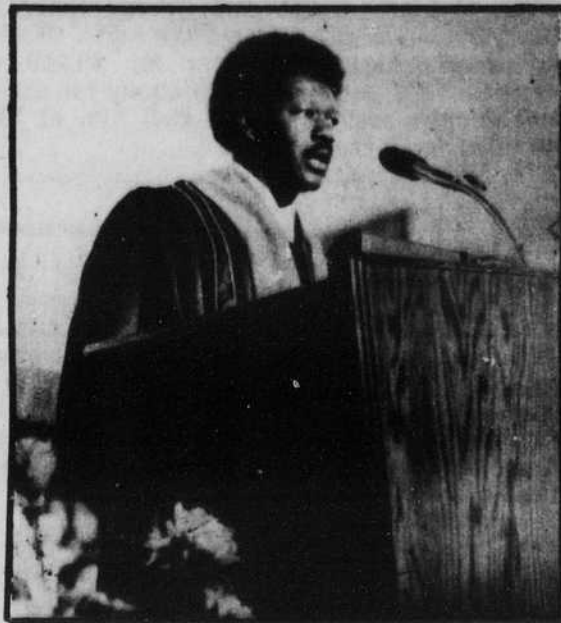

Rents In NLV To Be Raised

Rent payments for tenants of the North Las Vegas Housing Authority will start going up next month, authority executive director Robert Arrington said Thursday.

The rent increases have been mandated by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, according to Arrington.

Not all tenants of the authority's 873 units will see a rent increase in September, he said.

The new rent structure designed by HUD requires tenants to pay rent equal to 30 percent of their adjusted income or 10 percent of the gross income, Arrington said. The old formula called for tenants to spend 25 percent of their adjusted income on rent.
