THE HATCH ACT — IT LIMITS US

As we all know, our "Social Workers" in the community are usually the ones closest to the political structure (body politics). My definition of "Social Workers" are: Those who direct or administer community programs — may it be welfare, health services, or job development. You see, it takes some political maneuverability to get these social programs funded.

Of course, the by-product of these activities could/may develop a viable candidate for office or at least (his or her) influence can be felt in various political campaigns, which are now prohibited to some extent.

But, however, with the presence of the hatchet "Hatch Act", it prohibits our new kind of leaders the freedom they deserve. And of course, the knowledge of the different political climates, or, as we say in Las Vegas, it limits our "juice."

It is truly amazing how we can be oppressed — supposedly for our own good.

(Below you will find out what this writer means when you read the contents in Summary of the "Hatch Act.")

"The Hatch Act, as applied to State and local employees in federally aided programs, contains prohibitions against certain types of political activity.

"Under the Hatch Act You May Not:

1. Use your official authority or influence for the purpose of interfering with or affecting the result of an election or a nomination for office;

2. directly or indirectly coerce, attempt to coerce, command or advise a State or local officer or employee to pay, lend, or contribute anything of value to a party, committee, organization, agency, or person for political purposes; or

3. be a candidate for public elective office in a partisan primary, general, or special election.

"Other types of partisan political campaigning and management, which were previously prohibited, are now permitted under amendments to the Hatch Act effective January 1, 1975.
