Cavnar Calls Upon Private Industry To Help Combat Unemployment

This week, we shall talk to two candidates, those being the Republican candidate for state treasurer, Patty Cafferata and the Republican candidate for the Northern congressional seat, Ms. Barbara Vucanovich. They were both on hand last week at the *Westside Story* seeking some Black support in their efforts to reach their respective offices. Join us for the next few moments if you will and find out the stands and positions of the candidates and how it will affect you.

Ms. Cafferata, the Reno District No. 25 State Assemblywoman feels very strongly about the office of state treasurer. She firmly believes that the state revenues should be invested as much as possible within the state of Nevada. "This would create jobs and stimulate more investment within our state," she said. "Sixty-five percent of the state revenue has somehow been invested outside of our own state. Now even if investing outside means collecting higher interest on our state monies, that's not doing any good for the residents of our state. Those monies could be used to create more jobs for our own residents, instead it's going elsewhere, with the reason being; collecting a percent more on interest. That's really the main issue in this campaign."

Cafferata commented that she felt very good about the campaign. "I've met a lot of people one on one." When asked if she felt that the present national economic recession which may in part hurt President Reagan and fellow Republican candidates in general, will also have an affect on her campaign, she responded, "You know, the voters in Nevada are a breed apart. They tend to vote the person and not so much the party. I feel that we've been running a very good campaign. We have a lot of good ideas. Ideas that make sense. I'm getting the feedback that a majority of Nevadans too fell the same way. I feel very good about my chances."

The Assemblywoman pledged her support to work on behalf of all Nevadans to see to it that financial prosperity within our state gets back on track for everyone, and once it has, that it's continued.

Ms. Barbara Vucanovich, the Republican candidate for the Northern Nevada Congressional seat was introduced by County Commissioner Woodrow Wilson as being a "wise choice and tremendous asset for us (Nevadans) in Congress." He went on to say that it is important that she be one of our congressional representatives in Washington. Later on, she granted the *Vegas Voice* an exclusive interview. Here's some of the things that she said.

On how the campaign was presently going

"It's going great. We're in a tight race but we'll win."

On what she feels the issues to be

"Jobs and unemployment is what I feel the major issues are. Beyond those, I feel that some Nevadans are very independently concerned about "gut-heart" issues. Those such as losing their rights to carry guns. My opponent is for that and I'm strictly opposed. I also feel strongly about the bringing in of newer pollutant-free industry for our state. I noticed in North Las Vegas that a large furniture warehouse from southern California is being built there. That's what we need. Those type of industries. The kind that will employ three to four hundred people, but not a big pollutant threat."

On her strong assets as being A Congresswoman for Nevada

"My accessibility to President Reagan will be a very big asset to our state. I'll work with the President and not against him. I'll get important messages to the President pertaining to the continuation of our state moving in a more positive direction in regards to jobs, financial prosperity, employment and the things so vitally important to our state. I've known him personally for 25 years. I, along with Sen. Laxalt, have personal accessibility to the President and I'm quite positive that he'll listen to us and to the needs of Nevadans and its residents."

Do you feel confident that you'll win?

"Yes, I do!"

Greater The Votes, Greater The Power

Republican U.S. Congressional candidate Peggy Cavnar called upon private industry and the corporate sector of America to get behind President Reagan's "Job Partnership Act", which calls for the removal of over 1 billion dollars from the synfuel program which would be directed towards creating badly needed jobs.

Cavnar said that "in the past, government has failed in its "make-work" programs, with those jobs lasting only until its allotted monies run out. But with private industry enhancing the President's program, then America's unemployed can both work and train for permanent jobs already in existence."

The Congressional candidate told the Voice that her major concern, if she is elected to Congress, will be tourism. "Our main industry has to create more jobs." She said that her plan which she'll push in Congress would be to provide tax credits for industry located in our state to advertise outside of both the state and country. "This will have a direct effect on Nevada's economy," she feels. The candidate also reiterated that Nevada should diversify in other warehouse type industry. "There are thousands of open acres in Nevada. We should diversify in non-polluting industry on the vast land located in our state." She suggested high technology as being one industry that we should consider. "While we don't have the resources for highly trained personnel in this field, we should be focusing in on UNLV and Clark County Community College for job training programs in technology," she said.

Commenting on the present recession, Cavnar feels that its bottoming out. "With interest rates going down, investments in homes, autos and businesses will increase. It already has in some areas." She also noted that businesses can borrow cheaper now and with all of these promising signs, an increase in employment will follow suit. On the subject of interest rates, Cavnar felt that contrary to public suspicion, the lowering of interest rates isn't political. "If that were the case, the federal reserve would have lowered them even more." She feels this to be due to the government cutback in spending.

On Reaganomics, Cavnar said that she supports those policies because "those philosophies (economic) of the President's and mine are quite similar." As far as the president himself, Cavnar felt him to be doing an "excellent job." "When it comes to the rhetoric of his being insensitive to the poor, less affluent and women, I don't feel that to be true at all. His Job Partnership Act is evident of his concern for the unemployed. As far as women are concerned, he's appointed more of them to top level jobs than any other president in history."

When asked if she felt that she'll have Black support in next Tuesday's election, Cavnar responded that she didn't know. She maintained that she had "quite a bit of friendships in the black community," but she further stated that she looked at voters as being "people and not in terms of color."

Cavnar said she feels that she's the only choice for Congress, in that she'll be the "hardest working, most common sense, people-oriented congressman the state has ever seen." As far as the election goes, she hopes that the voters don't accept "politics as usual" in the congressional contest. "The good 'ole boys' way of doing things is a thing of the past. The voters should expect and receive open representative government with a congressman whom they'll have access to, and they should expect no less."

The one dream that Peggy Cavnar has, in her own words, is this one. "To get the United States back to the way our forefathers first found it with the concepts of our original Constitution and Bill of Rights."
