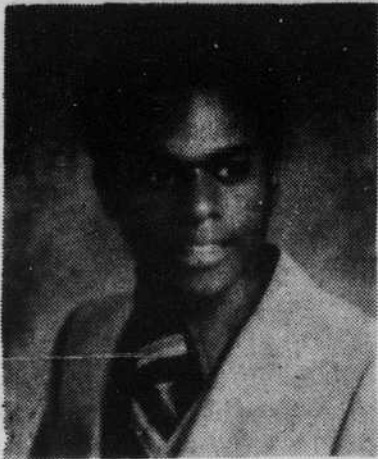


# SPORTS

The Rebel hoopsters officially open the season November 27th at the Convention Center against a highly touted Oklahoma club of the Big 8 Conference in a televised contest.

Joining Green and Anderson in the lineup will be record setting point guard Danny Tarkanian and former Los Angeles "Player of the Year" freshman Elridge Hudson. The fifth spot in the early part of the season is up for grabs but will eventually be filled by Jeff Collins, a transfer from the University of Arizona. Collins who is not eligible until early December will miss UNLV's first five games



but is said to be one of the new talents on the team.
