I remember when, some forty years ago before gambling was made legal in Nevada. Although illegal, it was open and notorious, and many people were loud in their demands that such places be closed, but to no avail. Then suit was begun to remove our "Big Sheriff" Sam Gay from office and in May the trial took place and Sam was found guilty and removed. That was an election year. Sam was a candidate for Sheriff in November and in spite of the efforts of the "Las Vegas Age" and many prominent people of the county, was triumphantly elected. That ended for the time our bitter fight against illegal gambling. However, in a few years the state legislature passed the law making gambling legal within the state.

Two important changes have taken place in recent years, in the Nevada gambling "industry." First, license fees have been so expensive that anyone holding same and operating under high costs in all other features of the business simply can't afford to take any chances. He is absolutely content to rely on the operation of that purely impersonal and infallible thing called "percentage." All games, as operated, have a definite percentage in favor of the operator (as in any other business). That percentage works constantly and is sufficient to give the operator a ample profit.

The state legislature has set up a commission to supervise this industry. The commission has adopted and strenuously enforces regulations for the control of the industry. Among other things it has adopted most rigorous supervision of all those licensed or working in the industry. The past history of any person applying for a gambling license is closely scrutinized and if his record is not as it should be, he is rejected.

It has been remarked that the commission itself might be swayed. This is hardly possible. Those who have millions invested in the fabulous casinos of Nevada, realize that their investments depend upon the good and spotless reputation of the gambling industry.

Just what I am trying to say is that, while there are great gambling houses operating illegally in all and every great city in America, here in

Nevada, those who play the games of chance get a honest and square deal.

Of course, as in many other kinds of entertainment, there are some who go to excess and gamble money they cannot afford. For these people there seems no remedy. They are found in every land and among every class of people and they imbed in many others — Bad or worse Habits.

The habit of gambling afflicts every class of human beings. It is born within us. But, Nevada has adopted the wisest and best means of handling yet devised. So, if you wish to gambol or to gamble, we advise you to come to Nevada.

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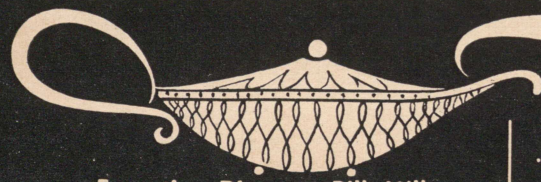

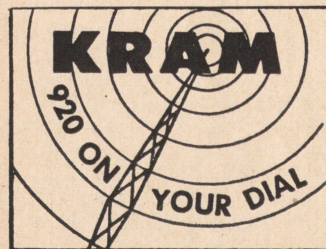

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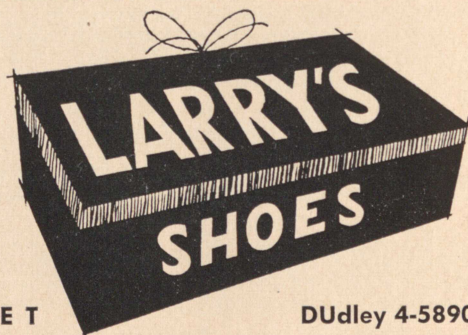
